Volunteers

Volunteer programs continued at the Art Center, with in-person opportunities returning in all programs. Volunteers contributed **2,812** hours over the past year, a value of **\$77,618**.

Interns

In the summer of 2021, the Art Center engaged nine undergraduate interns and two graduate level fellows, who were all paid as part of the Working Together program. The intern cohort participated in various professional development activities, including a museum career fair, an art making workshop led by a professional artist, and a career coaching workshop. This year's Working Together internship/fellowship program was successful in raising awareness of museum careers in young adults from underrepresented backgrounds.
